COMMUNITY EMPLOYMENT

CES has a new business partner! Jakprints is a screen printing company in Willoughby that does both small and large run clothing for local and national accounts. Jakprints approached CES for help filling a gap in their workforce. CES set up a group site two half days with the addition of 10-12 hours of independent work each week.

Originally we were to clean screens and tools, but that quickly turned into folding shirts and sweatshirts as well as tagging. Jakprints quickly saw the value of hiring individuals with disabilities. Our individuals made suggestions to improve on efficiencies and jumped in to help where they were asked. While Jakprints is

seasonal due to their products demand, we anticipate this will be a great partnership for years to come.

JOB COACH RECOGNITION

Jamie has done a great job in all these sites and has received accolades from the employers for her attention to detail and her ability to train her individuals to be more independent at their jobs.
